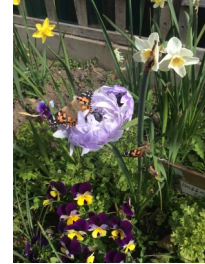




Early Years said a fond farewell to their beautiful butterflies.....

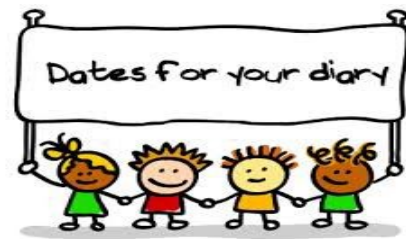
