Welcome back to the final half term of the academic year! This photograph shows the joyful relationships which have formed between our Year 6 children and their Reception buddies.

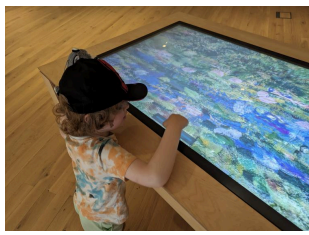

Thank you for your continued support.

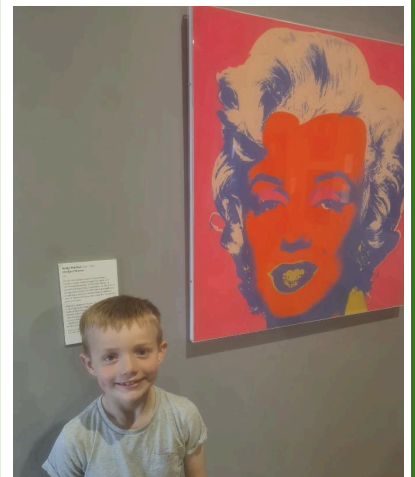


Year 6 had a fabulous time at the Brownlee Triathlon. It was, as always, such a great event!

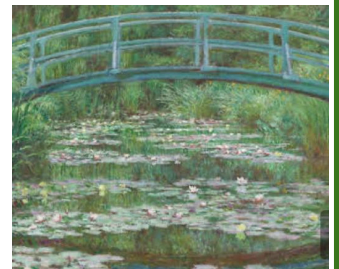
In Geography, Owls followed a map in the local area.
